The Park City Fire Service District is authorized to order the extinguishment of the open burning that creates or adds to a hazardous or objectionable situation.

OPEN BURNING REQUIREMENTS

OPENING BURNING PERIOD:

Start: Friday - May 8, 2009
Conclude: Friday - June 5, 2009

PERMIT TO BURN:

A permit to burn can be issued to property owners for the disposal of yard clippings, bushes, plants, grasses, tree limbs and similar vegetative materials pertaining to property cleanup. The burning of trash, rubbish, debris and construction materials is prohibited.

BURN PILES:

The size of burn piles can be no greater than 6-feet in diameter, and no higher than 4-feet.

LOCATION:

Fires must be located no less than 50-feet from any structure or not less than 15-feet if located in an approved container.

ATTENDANCE:

Fires must be constantly attended by a competent person with a hose connected to a water supply or other fire extinguishing equipment capable of containing the fire. The attendant is responsible for supervising the fire until it has been completely extinguished.

WEATHER:

The Air Quality Index must be checked prior to burning. For this information, contact the Utah Division of Air Quality at (801) 536-4000. Open burning is prohibited during windy conditions or where the atmospheric and local weather conditions makes such fires hazardous.

HOURS:

Open burning can only take place during daylight hours. Early morning hours are recommended. All fires must be completely extinguished before dusk.

NOTIFICATION:

After a permit has been issued, the permit holder must notify the Park City Fire Service District, Fire Prevention Bureau at (435) 940-2532, just prior to lighting the fire. In the event the Fire District cannot be contacted, the applicant must notify the Summit County Sheriff Dispatch office at (435) 615-3600. In the event the fire becomes out of control or unmanageable, call 9-1-1 immediately.

LIABILITY:

This permit shall be permission to start a fire under prescribed conditions, and serve as notification of intent to burn. The burning permit shall in no way relieve an individual from personal liability due to neglect or incompetence. Where a fire may escape control of the permit holder, and necessitate control actions from the Fire District, the responsible party may be held accountable for suppression costs or other damages.
